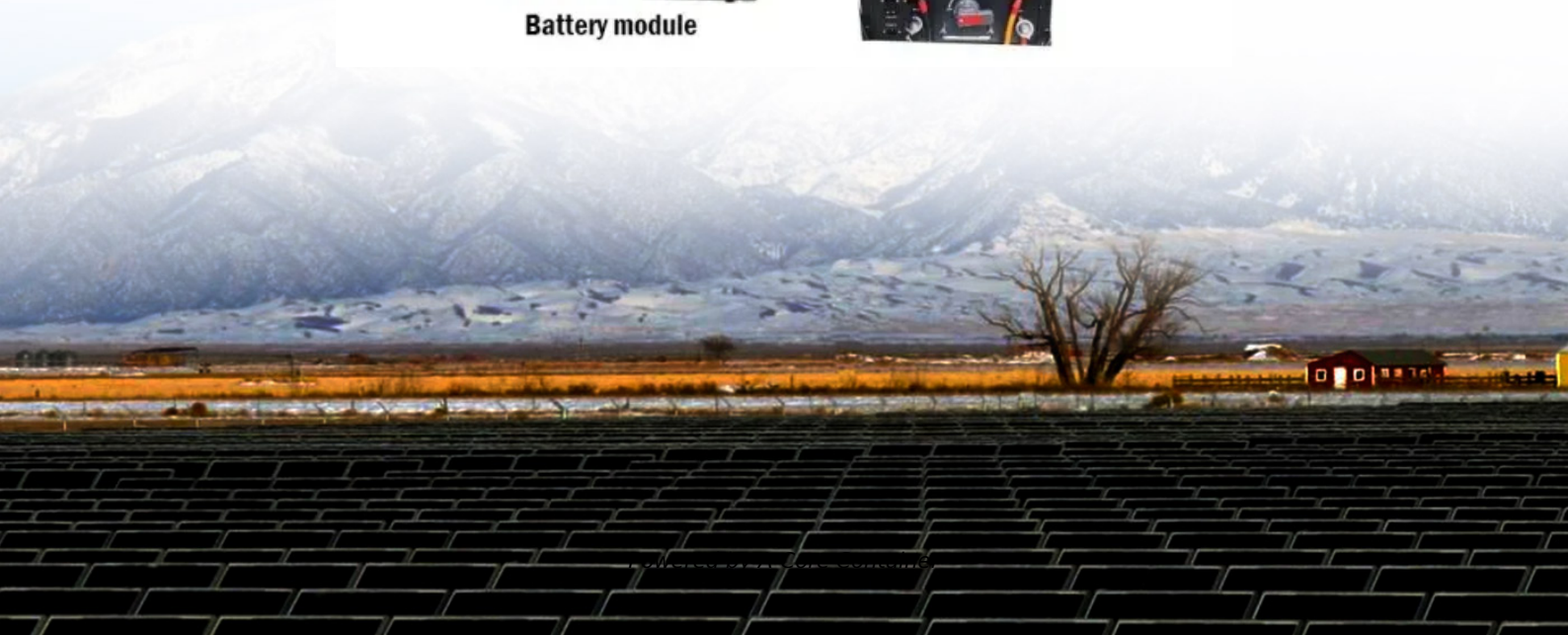

Overview

As of March 1, 2025, new TSA rules prohibit passengers from packing portable chargers, power banks, and cellphone battery charging cases that contain lithium-ion batteries in checked luggage. This rule also applies to spare external lithium batteries.

Lithium-ion batteries aren't allowed in checked bags because they're prone to overheating. Even high-quality lithium batteries, such as advanced charging banks and laptop batteries, can overheat after light damage. When lithium-ion batteries overheat, they smoke and, in bad cases, can catch fire.

Portable chargers or power banks containing a lithium ion battery must be packed in carry-on bags. Spare lithium batteries, which include both power banks and phone chargers, are prohibited in checked luggage. For more information, see the FAA guidance on portable rechargers. For more prohibited.

Lithium batteries, which power everyday devices, can catch fire if damaged or if battery terminals are short-circuited. Devices containing lithium metal batteries or lithium-ion batteries, including – but not limited to – smartphones, tablets, cameras, and laptops, should be kept in accessible.

To prevent inflight danger, many common items are restricted by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) and Federal. Can you take a lithium battery on a plane?

The TSA references the FAA in their lithium battery policy. If you're packing power chargers or power banks with lithium batteries, they cannot fly in a checked bag, they must be in your carry-on. Carry-on lithium batteries may have up to 100 watt hours. Lithium metal (non-rechargeable) batteries are permitted up to 2 grams of lithium per battery.

Are lithium batteries allowed in checked luggage?

However, these are strictly prohibited in checked luggage, and must be carried in your cabin bag. This rule applies to all types of lithium batteries, which pose a greater risk of fire if mishandled or damaged during transport. Each spare battery must be individually protected to prevent short circuits.

Can you travel with lithium batteries?

Traveling with lithium batteries Opens another site in a new window that may not meet accessibility guidelines. You can only travel with one life jacket in your checked bag, but it may be confiscated by the TSA.

However, spare batteries must be properly protected and carried in your cabin baggage, never in checked luggage.
