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Poland Energy Storage Battery Project



Overview

WARSAW, March 24, 2025 - Poland's largest utility, PGE, has announced plans to invest \$4.7 billion in battery storage projects to support the country's transition to renewable energy. What is the largest battery energy storage facility in Poland?

With a power output of 262 MW and a storage capacity of around 981 MWh, the facility will be by far the largest battery energy storage facility in Poland and one of the largest in Europe. The contractor on the project will be LG Energy Solution Wrocław.

What is the most advanced energy storage project in Poland?

The most advanced energy storage project in the PGE Group's portfolio is the Żarnowiec Energy Storage Facility. With a power output of 262 MW and a storage capacity of around 981 MWh, the facility will be by far the largest battery energy storage facility in Poland and one of the largest in Europe.

Why is battery storage important in Poland?

Amidst Poland's transition from traditional energy sources to a renewable-centric landscape, battery storage is well-positioned to help ensure the grid's operability, provide the system with firm capacity and complement the intermittent nature of renewable energy.

How much money does Poland spend on battery energy storage?

Poland has finalized a comprehensive subsidy program aimed at accelerating the deployment of battery energy storage systems (BESS), with a total budget of PLN 4 billion (approximately €1 billion).

Who will supply ESS batteries in Poland?

The contractor on the project will be LG Energy Solution Wrocław. The Polish unit of the Korean battery maker won the project tender offering the price of PLN 1.555 billion (\$384 million). On Monday, LG Energy Solution confirmed

that it had signed an agreement with PGE to supply 981MWh of grid-scale ESS batteries between 2026 and 2027.

How many GWh of energy storage capacity will Poland have by 2035?

In a bid to tackle the challenge of the growing electricity production from renewable energy sources, the Polish utility is looking to add more than 10 GWh of energy storage capacity by 2035. Its plans involve more than 80 projects, the value of which is estimated at around PLN 18 billion (\$4.7 billion).

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
