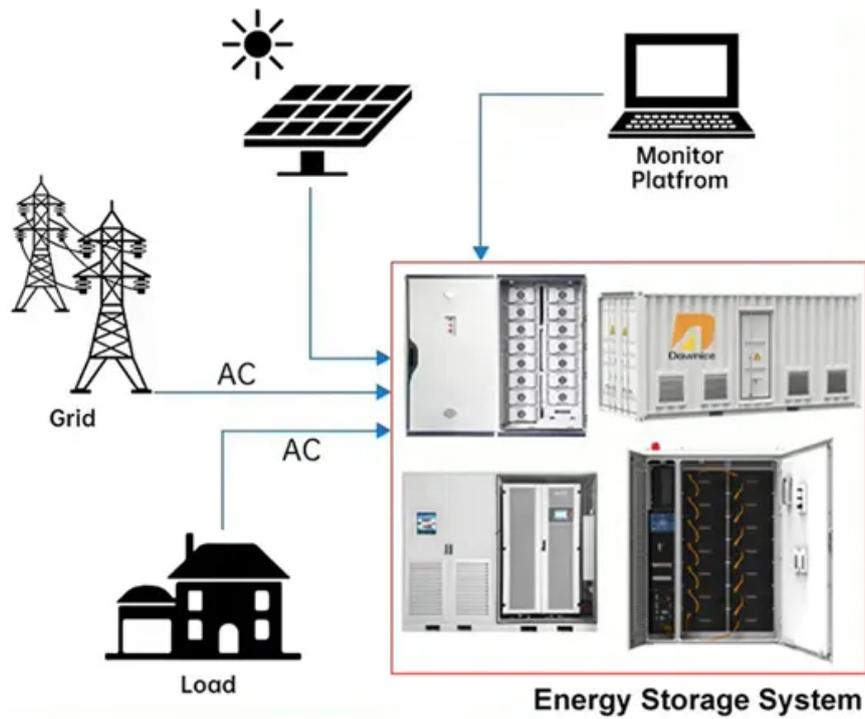

Solar Systems in Eritrea

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Overview

Small (0.8- to 1.2-kilowatt) photovoltaic systems power water pumps in 60 villages (about 3 percent of Eritrea's villages), with each system serving a minimum of 300 households. These systems provide lighting and power for 70 out of 700 rural schools.

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Eritrea, located on the Horn of Africa along the Red Sea, is a nation rich in potential but constrained by limited energy resources. Since gaining independence from Ethiopia in 1993, Eritrea has primarily relied on wood and imported oil for its energy needs, with little domestic oil or natural gas.

In Eritrea, where nearly half of the population lives in poverty, access to electricity remains a significant challenge. Only 53% of the population has access to electricity, 76% in urban areas and only 10% in rural regions. This limited access hinders economic opportunities; however, a recent push.
